

## MAINE DEFENSE INDUSTRY ALLIANCE (MDIA) IS A COLLABORATIVE EFFORT BETWEEN GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, AND INDUSTRY PARTNERS TO ADDRESS THE WORKFORCE NEEDS OF MAINE'S DEFENSE INDUSTRY.

The project aims to build a comprehensive, coordinated, and sustainable development system that will solve the Maine defense industry's two immediate needs: acquiring skilled workers and upgrading its incumbent workforce.

The defense industry is a significant contributor to Maine's economy, and meeting its workforce needs will require talent recruitment, direct short-term training for immediate employment, and an upskilling of the incumbent workforce. The MDIA project will help the state meet these demands.
