


Five programs offered by The Landing School

Wooden Boatbuilding

Students start the year with plans and a stack of wood, and work in teams of three or four to build a complete boat.





Hard skills:

- Hand and power tool proficiency
- Wooden boat construction techniques
- Marine finishing technique

Soft skills:

- Teamwork
- Problem solving
- Efficient workflow & time management
- Self confidence

After months of hard work... sea trials!

Students finish the year by going out on the boats that they have spent the last year building.

Last year, every wooden boatbuilding student who wanted a job was hired immediately after graduation.

This year two students already have jobs lined up.



Composite Boatbuilding

Students prepare for a career in cutting edge manufacturing and composite repair.









Students prepare to be marine technicians.






- Systems: All the things that make a boat go
 - Electrical
 - Mechanical
 - Plumbing
- Shop safety
- Proper tool use
- Diagnostics and repair
- ABYC certification
- Professional working habits

The first half of the year is a combination of lectures and labs.

Mornings are spent learning the theory, then afternoons are spent learning the practical application.





The second half of the year the focus is on project boats.

These are real boats with real owners, so the work must be done correctly.

Project boats are selected for their learning opportunities.

Boatyard Management

A second-year program that focuses on project management and mentorship.

Inter-Program Activity Period

Students have two options:

- stay on campus and spend a week experiencing a different program
- spend two weeks off-campus for an independent study with a business or organization associated with the marine industry
